"Japan's Friendship Ties Program" Kakehashi Project Japan, February 12-20, 2016

Objectives

The purpose of this program is to promote deeper mutual trust and understanding between the people of Japan and Canada as a basis for future friendship and cooperation, and to enhance the global understanding of Japan's society, history, diverse cultures, politics, and foreign policy.

Twenty-four exemplary students from the University of British Columbia (Vancouver and Okanagan) and the University of Victoria will be selected based on their academic and leadership achievements, as well as on their sense of purpose in participating in this visit to Japan.

Program Details

Proposed dates: February 12-20, 2016 (9 days)

Possible site visits and activities (subject to change):

- Universities and research centres
 - Companies and other field sites to learn about best practices in Japan
 - Meetings with government officials, politicians, and business leaders
 - NGOs
 - Cultural events

Included upon admission to program:

- Round-trip air ticket (economy class)
- Accommodation
- Meals
- Program-related transportation within Japan

Not included:

- Personal expenses
- Transport to YVR airport
- Baggage fees

Selection Criteria

This program is open to graduate (PhD, MA, MBA) and upper-level undergraduate (third- and fourth-year) students enrolled at UBC and UVic. The delegation will include both undergraduate and graduate students.

Students with Canadian citizenship are eligible for this program. Those with permanent resident status are invited to apply (additional review may be required). Students holding dual citizenship with Japan are ineligible. The delegation will be selected through a joint committee administered by the University of British Columbia and the University of Victoria.

Applications will be evaluated based on:

- Commitment and motivation for participating in the program
- Academic achievement
- Focused interest in Japan
- Possible impact on applicant's future goals
- Recommendation from referee

Application Requirements and Procedures

Applicants are required to provide the following:

- 1. Statement of purpose (maximum of 500 words) describing:
 - Why you wish to participate in this program
 - What you hope to accomplish during this trip, why you wish to achieve this, and how this will impact your future
 - Your previous experience in Japan (length and purpose)
 - Any coursework related to Japan, including cross-cultural and comparative studies
 - How this program might be related to future goals (academic or professional)
 - Name, email, and telephone number of a faculty member willing to act as your reference
- 2. Academic transcript (unofficial transcripts are acceptable if obtained directly from applicant's university website)
- 3. A current resumé/CV

- 1. The subject line must clearly indicate: "Japan Kakehashi Application" followed by your campus and year level (3, 4, or MA, MBA, PhD). e.g., "Japan Kakehashi Application UVic 4"
- 2. Please collate all three required pieces of your application (statement, transcript, resumé) into one PDF file and name the file as: Last name, First name_kakehashi2016.doc

e.g., "Lin, Meredith kakehashi 2016.doc"

- 3. Documents should be arranged order of:
 - a. Statement of purpose
 - b. Transcript
 - c. Resumé/CV

Participation and Follow-up

Each participant must sign a waiver allowing us to photographs you during the tour and to use your name and image in publications by the Center for Japanese Research, Centre for Asia-Pacific Initiatives, Consulate-General of Japan, and Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada.
