THIRD NATIONAL SURVEY ON CANADIAN PUBLIC ATTITUDES ON CHINA AND CANADA-CHINA RELATIONS

Report of Collected Data

Method: Qualtrics panel survey of 1,503 Canadian adults (19+); adjusted to match the latest census data on age, gender, and region; in the field September 26 to October 3, 2019; margin of error +/- 3%; median completion time of 13 minutes. The survey was conducted in English and French.

In total, 18 demographic questions¹ (including party affiliation/level of support) and 20 questions plus 17 sub-questions on substantive matters and preferences. Note that when applicable, responses of "Don't Know" or "Undecided" are included in the findings.

About this report: The substantive questions are presented first, followed by the demographic questions. For each substantive question, the wording of the question is presented as it was shown to the respondents, together with a table summarizing the results. A graph shows at a glance what the question was about. The wording in some graphs has been simplified.






1. In your view, how important are the following countries to Canada's future?
















9. Do you support or oppose the Canadian government entering into a free trade agreement with China?


Support for FTA with China




11. Looking out over the next ten years, are China's increasing military and defense capabilities a serious concern for Canada?

Are Chinese increasing military capabilities a concern?






Should Canada increase defense spending for China?
















29. How strongly do you associate with [your] party?

How strongly do you associate with your party?





How often do you learn news about China:




How often do you use this source for your news about China?



Social media platforms used for information on China




